A fine Austrian mabogany cased grand-sonnerrie striking Lanterndlubr. The 3-train movement of 8 day duration with steel rod pendulum strikes the hours and quarters on two gongs.

A rare George III tavern timepiece, the bombé shaped case with chinoiserie and print figured decoration on the trunk. Circa 1780 Height: 54 in (137.2 cm) D

A very small and unusual ebonised fusee wall timepiece with engraved silvered dial. Circa 1830 Diameter: 7 3/4 in (19.7 cm) A



◀ **HENRY MASSY, LONDON**
A fine late 17th century ebony and gilt mounted hour striking and quarter repeating bracket clock by this well known maker. Circa 1695-1700 Height 16 in (40.5 cm) E

WEEKS, COVENTRY STREET, LONDON ▶
A superb George III satinwood mantel timepiece, the swept veneered case on bracket feet supporting the fuse movement within the gilt drum top, surmounted by a central urn finial. Circa 1800 Height: 15 in (38.1 cm) C



CHARLES CABRIER, LONDON ▶
An exceptional Queen Anne marquetry quarter chiming longcase clock of elegant proportions with its original caddy top and square brass dial. Circa 1705 Height: 96 in (244 cm)
