





ROBERT MANLEY, LONDON *

A good George III period mahogany musical bracket clock. The 8-day triple fusee movement strikes the bours on a bell and plays either of the tunes Lovely Nancy or Harvest Home on twelve bells, on the bour. Circa 1790 Height: 20 in (51 cm)





JOHN GORDIN, LONDON >

A fine late 17th century ebony and gilt mounted bour striking and pull quarterrepeating verge bracket clock by this exceptional maker whose work bears similarities to that of Daniel Quare. Circa 1695 Height: 13 in (33 cm)
