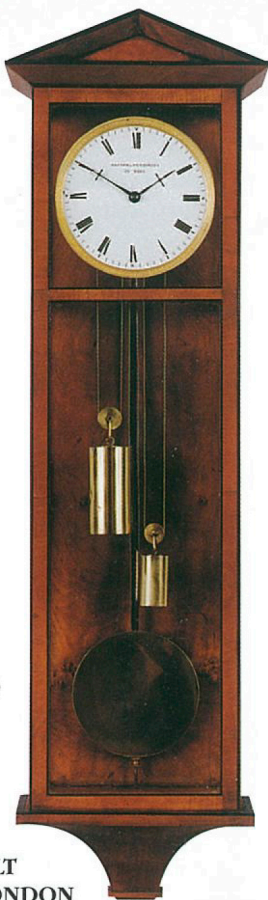

*A beautiful Scottish mahogany brass dial 8 day longcase clock with hour strike, strike-silent and well proportioned case with swan neck hood. Circa 1775. Height 84 in. (213 cm)*

*A fine English striking lantern clock with original verge escapement and signed on the engraved dial centre 'J. Windmills, London', with entwined dolphin frets and surmounted by the hour bell. Circa 1700. Height 15 in. (38 cm)*

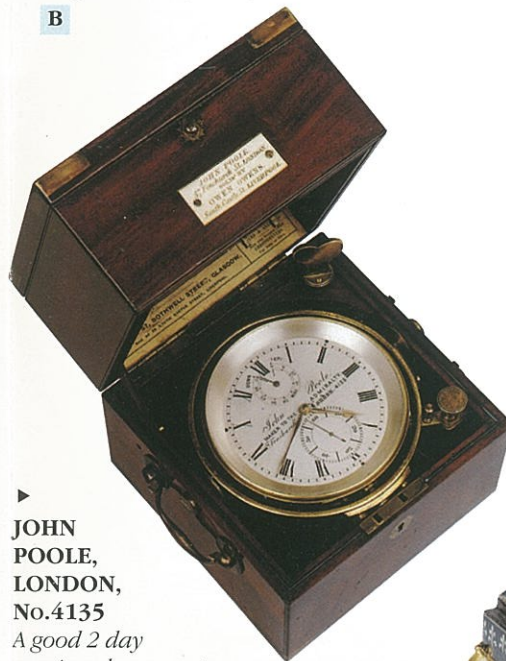

*A good 2 day marine chronometer with brass bound 3-tier mahogany case. Circa 1840. Dimensions 7 in. (18 cm) square.*

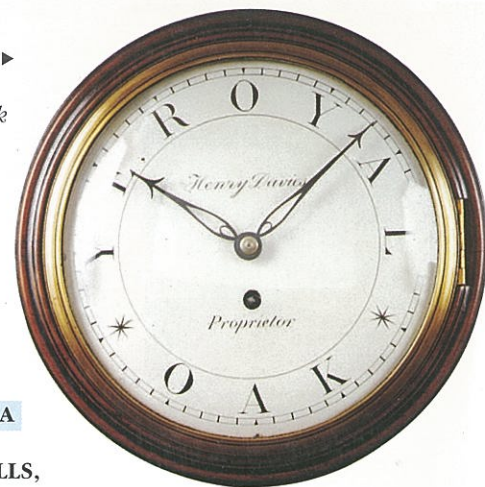

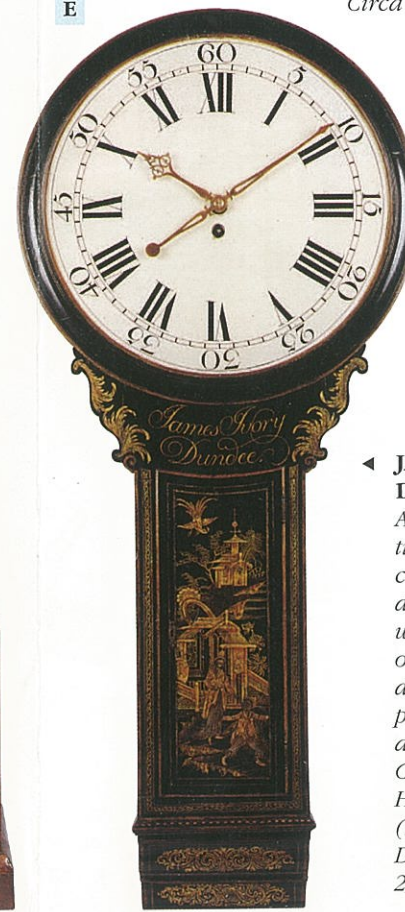

*A very original burr walnut longcase clock of fine proportions and colour, the 11inch square dial with signed silvered chapter ring, matted centre and typical pierced blued-steel hands. Circa 1705. Height 83 in. (211 cm)*

**SIMMONS, LONDON** ▼  
*A good small William IV rosewood library timepiece with engraved silvered dial and fusee movement, the case with recessed brass carrying handle and adjustable bun feet. Circa 1835. Height 7¼ in. (18.5 cm)*

**GAUDRON À PARIS** ▶  
*A rare and small Louis XIV period striking ebony and red tortoise-shell veneered mantel clock, with later matching wall bracket, the movement with balance wheel verge escapement and hour striking on a bell. Circa 1690. Overall height 18½ in. (47 cm)*

◀ **POLTI, EXETER**  
*A rare mid 18th century mabogany stick barometer with finely carved cistern cover and pierced surround to partly conceal the mercury tube, the signed register plate unusually made of copper. Circa 1750. Height 36 in. (91.5 cm)*

**HUNT & ROSKELL, NEW BOND STREET, LONDON, No. 799** ▼  
*A fine 8-day marine chronometer by Hunt & Roskell, London, with rosewood and brass edged 3-tier case, with fully signed, silvered and engraved dial indicating seconds and up and down. Circa 1845. Dimensions of box 7½ in. (19 cm) square*

**HOLMES, 156 STRAND, LONDON** ▶  
*A classically elegant and refined mabogany longcase clock by this famous maker, the silvered dial 8 day movement with strike/silent. Circa 1790. Height 89 in. (226 cm)*
